- d. Read 1 John 5:3. Why do we obey God's commands?
- e. In Galatians 5:22,23, we have learned some of the fruits of faith that God wants us to show in our lives as disciples of Christ. They are: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Tell ways you can show fruits of faith in the following situations:
 1. You see someone who is left out and lonely.
 2. You hear about a family that lost its house due to a fire.
 3. A friend worries about her sins and is depressed.
 4. A child keeps asking question after question.
 5. You hear about people in a far-away country whom missionaries are trying to reach with the good news about Jesus.
