10. Where do you see the love of God in this lesson?
11. What does God teach you to do in this lesson?

Lead

12. What would be a good situation in which to share this message?

Additional Questions

13. Why did God place that tree with the forbidden fruit in Eden in the first place?
14. How did we all become sinful through what Adam and Eve did? Define “original” or “inherited” sin.
15. Note that the first sacrifice, the first picture of what Christ needed to do, is found in Genesis 3:21.
16. Why was it necessary for Adam and Eve to leave the Garden of Eden?
