Pre-Lesson Preparation

Read Genesis 9:18-29; 11:1-9, the sons of Noah and the Tower of Babel.

Lesson Goal

- 13. Why was building the tower so wrong? Weren't the people just creating a beautiful and notable work of architecture?
- 14. Did the Lord really need to "come down" in order to know what was happening (vs. 5)?
- 15. How did the language barrier protect the people?
- 16. Compare the story of the Tower of Babel with the happenings on the Day of Pentecost in Acts 2:1-13.
