LESSON 3—King Hezekiah

Questions and Answers—Student Guide

Lesson goal: The goal of this lesson is to answer the question, "What kind of man was Hezekiah?"

Pre-Lesson Preparation

Read 2 Kings 18 and 19, the account of King Hezekiah. Note that his father was evil, but perhaps his mother, Abijah, feared the Lord. Hezekiah followed in the path of this ancestor David. He removed the false altars in the mountains, smashed the sacred stones, and cut down the Asherah poles. He also destroyed the bronze serpent made by Moses, because the Israelites were worshiping it like an idol. Hezekiah submitted to the Lord and placed his hope in him like none of the kings before or after him, and the Lord was with him. He also did not submit to the king of Assyria.
