Additional questions

- a. Jesus taught us to have our eyes open to helping others, and many times in the Bible he showed us how this is done. A servant of God, King David, also showed how to search for ways to help people. David had a friend named Jonathan who had died. Shortly after becoming king, David, wanted his servant Ziba to tell him if any of Jonathan's family was still alive. The servant likely thought David wanted to kill anyone who might be a threat to the king, because that's what kings did long ago. Read 2 Samuel 9:3-7. Whom did David show kindness to? What trouble did he have?
- b. David and Mephibosheth were not alike when it came to health, riches, power, or number of friends. Yet David looked for ways to help Mephibosheth. In what ways are people around you different from you?
- c. It's easy to think, "Oh, I don't know how to reach *that* person," or, "He probably won't listen anyway." It's also easy to think, "She's really a bad person. I'm not wasting my time on her." But whom did Jesus search for and help? Jesus knew this sinful woman needed to see her sins and that he had come to save her. He used his eyes, his heart, his words, and his power to help the woman.
